

rustic hotel situated on the site of the valley's first homestead. Owners Ginger and Brigham Edwards have plans to sell homegrown tea; herb gardens and flowers ring the four-acre property.

Back in town, trailblazers refuel at the Salmonberry Saloon. Open this past spring, the restaurant's hyperlocal menu boasts Nehalem River Ranch beef burgers, spicy local greens, and a tight list of Oregon wines. Heading south to Tillamook and beyond? Coastal yeasts add tang to de Garde's "truly wild" beers; the new, 42,800-square-foot Tillamook Creamery, meanwhile, is a two-floor dairy temple. The food trail winds next around sleepy Netarts Bay, home to Jacobsen Salt's main manufactory (an on-site kiosk offers a rainbow of saline flakes) and Nevør Shellfish Farm, where an oyster window vends tørkes, kumamotos, and sweet little Olympias straight from the source. Grill the haul at Cape Lookout State Park, where dappled picnic areas hide among the towering hemlocks and spruce.

PACIFIC CITY

CAPE KIWANDA might be the smallest of the promontories studding the **Three** Capes Scenic Drive. But anyone who's sunk toes in Pacific City's mile-long city beach knows this fragile, sandstone behemoth is the real stunner. Overnighters can soak up the splendor from private balconies and patios at the months-old

Headlands Coastal Lodge & Spa (rooms from \$450/ night, headlandslodge. com)-the North Coast's most luxurious new accommodations. At the hotel's ocean-to-table Meridian Restaurant, scarf impossibly fluffy pancakes doused in huckleberry jam, a razor clam "Caesar," and hot-honev-spiked black rockfish. The Headlands' owners are also the folks behind Pelican Brewery right across the sandy parking lot; frame the ludicrous-cool views of

Pacific City's own Haystack Rock with pints of Kiwanda Cream Ale and Tsunami Stout. You might even sight the local dory boat fleet making for land with the day's catch-something to celebrate with beach bonfires by moonlight. Work up an appetite first, with a nine-mile out-andback hike north along the Oregon Coast Trail to Sitka Sedge State Natural Area-Oregon's newest state park, dedicated just this past April. –RD 🗖
